The Conservation Fund

Permanent Conservation Supports Longevity For Both Ranchers and Birds

The Conservation Fund plays a significant role in some of the largest landscape conservation projects for sage grouse. In partnership with the Sage Grouse Initiative (SGI), the Fund works with private landowners and regional partners to implement easements that forever conserve native range, and protects the future for ranching families. In Wyoming, Idaho and Colorado, the Fund has protected over 100,000 acres of sage grouse habitat.

The Fund established the Wyoming Sage Grouse Conservation Campaign, which has conserved 15 properties totaling more than 58,500 acres. The Espenscheid Family's ranch in Wyoming's Green River Valley is one of those properties. This ranch's conservation easement permanently protects thousands of acres of crucial wintering range and migration corridors for pronghorn, mule deer, moose and elk as well as important sagebrush and wetland habitats for sage grouse, songbirds, shorebirds and numerous aquatic species. Their ranch is one of the oldest operating ranches held by one family in the area.
